HIGHWAYS MATTERS

478 HIGHWAYS LIGHTING

1. Heol Ray Gravell

It was **RESOLVED** to install a third light in the road at a cost of £1,300 + VAT. The County Council will be requested to carry out the work.

2. Lighting at Parc Pendre

Total cost of lighting the path would be £4,000 + VAT. Mr Francis, Lighting Officer, has indicated that the County Council would be prepared to fund 50% of this. It was **RESOLVED** to install this lighting.

3. Lighting in Parc Stephens

Cost of a light near the Youth Club would be £1,500 + VAT. The Rugby Club have requested that a light be installed near the tennis court. The County Council has indicated that it would be prepared to fund 50% of the installation costs if the Town Council would add running costs to its footway lighting schedule. It was **RESOLVED** to defer this matter until the next financial year.

479 SIGNAGE

1. Community Halls

Mr McEvoy supplied location maps for the signs for the Community Halls which were circulated to members. The locations were approved. Cost of the signs is awaited.

2. Twinning Signs

Mr McEvoy has provided the name of the company that supplied the signs at Newcastle Emlyn. "Image Display" have indicated that costs would be approximately £750+VAT per sign, depending on the design features required. Simple signs to be attached to the existing gateway signs will be considered.

4. Castle Street

Residents have complained that there is inadequate signage for Castle Street. Consequently, mail and deliveries are misdirected to Castle Road. Mr McEvoy agreed that the sign was sited at the wrong end of the one way system. He will investigate the matter.

5. Lady Street

Signage to prevent traffic entering the one way street from the wrong direction was reported as compliant. The Traffic Management Engineer does not recommend changing the existing signs. White lines across the entrance to the bowls club – the Bowls Club has applied for white access protection markings across their entrance. County Councillor K.Davies will request the County Council to repaint the road markings in the area.

6. Horeb Road

Priority signs. The Accident research & Prevention Engineer has provided the council's planning authority with an estimated cost to provide a 20mph speed limit on all the approaches to this junction, along with new street lighting, traffic signage, markings and a raised junction plateau. This may be dependent on planning permission being granted for a housing development in the vicinity. A residents meeting has been arranged to consider this matter.

480 SPEED LIMIT - CARMARTHEN ROAD

The Town Clerk reported that the letter from the County Council showed Carmarthen Road as a continuation of Water Street to the roundabout at Parc y Bocs. The County proposed to extend the 30MPH to approximately half way along Carmarthen Road. The Town Council proposed a 30MPH limit all the way to the roundabout. Confirmation of the County Council's decision is awaited.

481 PEDESTRIAN CROSSINGS

Assessment criteria for the installation of pedestrian crossing facilities have been received from the County Council and circulated to Town Council members for consideration.

482 GARAGES IN HOREB ROAD, MYNYDDYGARREG

The Asset Management Strategy is currently considering the future of County garages. The recommendation is to remove all garages and use the land afterwards. The County Council has been informed that the Town Council would like the land to be used for car parking as this would ease the traffic congestion on this road. They have indicated that this would be an appropriate use of the land and are considering this option.

ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES

483 DOG FOULING

Mr Mike Roberts, Environment Officer of the County Council, attended the meeting on 11th November 2008 and gave an informative presentation on current and proposed enforcement issues relating to dog fouling. Dog Control Orders will be brought into effect from April 2009. To negate the need for the Town Council to be involved in charging mechanisms, the County Council will enforce the orders. The Town Council will be responsible for erecting signage. The police will be closely involved in the enforcement activities.

484 RECYCLING

After open surgery sessions organised by the County Council, a main concern reported was the non collection of glass. Glass cannot be collected in the blue bags, due to health & safety reasons. Residents should be encouraged to use the existing waste recycling centres but the County Council recognised that some residents would be unable to access these. Bottle banks have been requested for 5 locations in Kidwelly and 2 in Mynyddygarreg. A site visit will be arranged with the County Council to identify suitable locations.

A green waste disposal site, as requested by the Town Forum was considered impractical. Concerns over vermin at the site were expressed. Compost bins are available from the County Council.

485 PARKS STEERING GROUP

A meeting of the steering group was held on 25th November 2008. Minutes have been circulated. The next meeting of the group will be on 20th January 2009.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

INSTALLATION OF CCTV CAMERAS

In view of recent research, members questioned the effectiveness of CCTV as a deterrent especially in relation to its cost effectiveness. Using a CCTV system to monitor residents implied a lack of respect for those in the community. It was **RESOLVED** to meet with the police and the equipment supplier to assess the effectiveness and practicality of using the present system before making a decision on further purchases or upgrades or the removal of the system altogether.

KIDWELLY TOWN COUNCIL WEBSITE - IT SYSTEMS

The new website for Kidwelly Town Council is complete. Training for Council staff to manage the site has been included in the contract. Website development will include links with other organisations/businesses in the area, who have been contacted. Arrangements for a Welsh translation are being made. Note and Close this item.

These matters were raised again at the Kidwelly Partnership meeting on 17th September 2009.
